A Marriage That Works – Relationships That Work Ephesians 5:18, 31-33 2-13-22

Hebrews 13:4 - "Marriage should be honored by everyone."

1 Corinthians 7:7 (NLT) – "I wish everyone were single, just as I am. Yet each person has a special gift from God, of one kind or another."

In America, Marriage is:

- **1.** Dishonored.
- 2. Delayed.
- **3.** A trial run.
- 4. Used to solve problems.
- **5.** Redefined.

Matthew 19:4-6 (NLV) — "He said...<u>He Who made them</u> in the first place <u>made them man and woman?</u> It says, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and his mother and will live with his wife. <u>The two will become one</u>.' So they are no longer two but one. <u>Let no man divide what God has put together</u>."

God created Marriage:

I. To Reflect Christ and His Church.

Ephesians 5:32 – "This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church."

Ephesians 5:18 - "And do not get drunk with wine... but be filled with the Spirit..."

Results of being filled with Him:

1. <u>Teaching and praise</u>.

Ephesians 5:19 – "...addressing (proclaiming toward) one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs singing and (praising) to the Lord with your heart..."

2. Thankfulness.

Ephesians 5:20 – "...giving thanks always and for everything to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ..."

3. Looking after <u>one another's interests</u>.

Ephesians 5:21 – "submitting to one another out of reverence for Christ."

Husbands are to:

1. Give affectionate and sacrificial love.

Ephesians 5:25 – "<u>Husbands</u>, love your wives, <u>as Christ loved the church</u> and gave himself up for her..."

2. Live in God's truth.

Ephesians 5:26 – "...that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the <u>washing of water with</u> the word..."

3. Treat her as God's daughter.

Ephesians 5:27 – "so that he <u>might present the church to himself</u> in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish."

4. Meet needs.

Ephesians 5:28 – "In the same way husbands should love their wives as their own bodies."

Wives are to:

1. Follow Christ.

Ephesians 5:22 – "Wives, submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord."

2. Support her <u>husband's leadership</u>.

Ephesians 5:22 – "... submit to your own husbands, as to the Lord"

3. Respect her husband.

Ephesians 5:33 – "...let the wife see that she respects her husband."

Genesis 2:18 – "It is not good for the man to be alone. I will make a <u>companion</u> who is <u>right for</u> him."

II. For the Multiplication and Protection of Children.

Genesis 1:28 – "... Then God blessed them and commanded them, 'Be fruitful and multiply! Fill the earth!""

Every child needs his/her parents to:

1. Love and trust God.

Psalm 20:7-8 — "Some trust in chariots and some in horses, but we trust in the name of the Lord our God. They <u>collapse and fall</u>, but we <u>rise and stand upright</u>."

2. Cultivate their identity.

Isaiah 43:1 - "...I have called you by name; you are mine."

Proverbs 14:26 – "Those who obey and respect the Lord have a secure fortress; their children have a place of refuge and security."
