Maturity for Today James Overview James 1:1-4 9-13-20

God says **maturity** is continual growth in Christ-like attitudes, words and actions.

Mature (telos) – Whole, perfect, complete and effective.

I. What Maturity is Not:

- 1. Age
- 2. Appearance
- 3. Achievement
- 4. Academics

Reputation and **recognition** are what people say about us, our **identity** and **character** are what God says about us.

II. Marks of A Mature Person:

1. Rejoicing under pressure.

James 1:2-4 – "Count it all joy, my brothers, when you meet trials of various kinds, for you know that the testing of your faith produces steadfastness. And let steadfastness have its full effect, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking in nothing."

2. Loving God and our neighbor.

James 2:8-9 – "If you really fulfill the royal law according to the Scripture, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself,' you are doing well. But if you show partiality, you are committing sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors."

3. Speaking Christ-like words.

James 3:2 – "For we all stumble in many ways. And if anyone does not stumble in what he says, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle his whole body."

IV. Living in God's Peace.

James 4:1 – "What causes quarrels and what causes fights among you? Is it not this, that your passions are at war within you?"

V. Patiently Praying. James 5:7, 16

James 5:7 – "Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains."

James 5:16 – "*Therefore, confess your sins to one another and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person has great power as it is working.*"

The Maturity Test:

- ~ Do I handle problems well?
- ~ Am I loving others and sensitive to their needs?
- ~ Do I speak like Jesus?
- ~ Am I a peacemaker?
- ~ Do I patiently wait for answers to prayer without giving up or complaining?
