The Presence of Jesus Luke 2:1-20 12-20-20

I. Jesus' Presence Fulfills All of God's Promises.

Luke 2:1-7 – "And Joseph also went to...<u>Bethlehem</u>...And Mary gave birth to <u>her</u> <u>firstborn son</u>...and laid him in a manger, because there was <u>no place for them in the</u> inn."

Genesis 3:8 – "They heard the sound of the Lord God walking in the garden in the cool of the day..."

Exodus 33:14 – "He said, 'My presence shall go with you, and I will give you rest.""

Psalm 140:13 – "The godly will dwell in Your presence."

Buddhist Poet: Gods here? Who can know? Not I. Yet I sigh and tears flow tear on tear.

Acts 2:2-4 – "Suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty <u>rushing</u> <u>wind</u>...And they were <u>all filled with the Holy Spirit</u>."

II. Jesus' Presence Brings Joy for All of the Nations.

Luke 2:10-11 — "And the angel said... 'Fear not, for behold, I bring you <u>good news of</u> <u>great joy</u> that will be <u>for all the people.</u> For unto you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord.'"

Psalm 16:11 – "In Your presence is fullness of joy..."

Psalm 17:15 – "I will be satisfied with Your presence."
