- 4. Jesus never took on their life, values, language, thinking, morals...He showed them His.

Main Themes

- 1. Review and discuss the sermon with someone.
- 2. What percentage of your time is spent within a "Christian Ghetto"? Without neglecting the importance of the body of Christ, how can you make changes to your schedule and be more visible as a light? Come up with two or three practical ways to implement this week.
- 3. Think of at least two people in your sphere of influence with whom you interact with regularly. In what ways have you neglected to see and engage them as people? What are some specific questions you can ask to make them feel loved and cared for?
- 4. Identify at least two people or families in your sphere of influence who are hurting. How does Jesus offer love and encouragement to their hurt? With your family, or on your own, come up with a real-life strategy to love those people or families. Be specific when planning events, or ways to serve.
- 5. Read Matthew 5:14-16. Who can you be the light of the world? How can you be the light of the world this week?

2- Preparing for Next Sunday Following Jesus: Relying on Jesus' Finished Work At The Cross Isaiah 52:13- 53:12

- 1. Read Isaiah 52:13 53:12. How is Jesus described?
- 2. How is Jesus' earthly appearance and life described and how should that impact us?
- 3. How will He die according to this prophecy?
- 4. Why is his substitution in our place needed? (Romans 3:23, 6:23; John 8:31-36)
- 5. What will Jesus see after His death on the cross? (53:10)
- 6. Who ultimately put Christ to death and why? (53:10)
- 7. How often do you thank Him for taking your place on the cross, and why is it important to do so?
- 8. Pray for someone you know to trust in Christ and His work on the cross.
