Prophets and Kings: The Holy God Reveals Himself to Isaiah Isaiah 6:1-8

God's Holiness – Perfection, uniqueness and separateness.

Isaiah 43:15 - "I am the LORD, your Holy One, The Creator of Israel, your King."

Job 6:10 - "...I rejoice in severe pain...I have not denied the words of the Holy One."

1 Samuel 2:2 - "There is no one holy like the LORD, Indeed, there is no one besides You..."

Psalm 47:8 - "God reigns over the nations, God sits on His holy throne."

Psalm 77:13 - "Your way, O God, is holy; What god is great like our God?"

Psalm 99:5 - "Exalt the LORD our God...Holy is He."

Leviticus 22:32 - "You shall <u>not profane My holy name</u>, but <u>I will be sanctified</u> among the sons of Israel; I am the LORD who sanctifies you."

Psalm 33:21 - "For our heart rejoices in Him, because we trust in His holy name."

Isaiah 5:16 - "But the LORD of hosts <u>will be exalted in judgment</u>, And the holy God will <u>show Himself holy in righteousness</u>."

John 17:11 - "I am no longer in the world; and yet they themselves are in the world, and I come to You <u>Holy Father</u>, keep them in Your name, the name which You have given Me, that they may be one even as We are."

Acts 4:27 - "...they were gathered together against Your holy servant Jesus..."

2 Peter 1:21 - "For no prophecy had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were <u>carried along by the Holy Spirit</u>."

1 Peter 1:15-16 - "But as He who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, since it is written, 'You shall be holy, for I am holy.""

Hebrews 12:14 - "...without holiness no one will see the Lord."

1. Missing the mark. 2. Willfully stepping across the line. 3. Breaking God's commandments. 4. Corrupt III. In Christ we get grace and a mission. (Isaiah 6:6-8) Why Confess our Sins as Believers? 1. For cleansing and restoration in our relationships. Matthew 5:23-24 - "Jesus said, 'Therefore, if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there in front of the altar. First go and be reconciled to your brother; then come and offer your gift." 2. For healing of the body in the body. James 5:13-16 - "Is anyone among you suffering?... Is anyone among you sick?... pray... call the elders...if he has committed sins he will be forgiven..." Therefore, confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.
