Missional: Living daily for the mission of Christ to see people love God, love others and become disciple-makers.

Church: Consists of everyone, everywhere, who has a faith relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.

Spirit-led: Living daily relying on the Spirt as we learn from Scripture how to leave our old life behind and walk in our new life in Christ.

- 5. Review the eight marks of a Spirit-led ministry from Sunday. Which one do you want to grow? How is MCC doing with these characteristics? How can you help your family grow in these?
- 6. Why should we pray individually and as a group? (Psalm 5:3, 34:15, Matthew 7:7, Mark 9:24, Luke 18:13-14, John 16:24, Ephesians 1:15-20 and James 1:5, 5:13-18).
