The Story Begins: Dysfunctional People and God's Promises Genesis 27 3-15-20

Dysfunctional - Broken or behaving outside the model.

I. A <u>Disobedient</u> Dad. (Genesis 27:1-4)

Genesis 25:23 — "And the Lord said to her, 'Two nations are in your womb...the older shall serve the younger."

II. A <u>Defiant</u> Son. (Genesis 27:1-4)

Genesis 25:31-34 — "Jacob said, '<u>Sell me your birthright now</u>.' Esau said, '<u>I am about to die</u>; of what use is a <u>birthright to me</u>?' Jacob said, 'Swear to me <u>now</u>.'...(He) sold his birthright to Jacob...he <u>ate, drank, rose and went his way</u>."

Genesis 26:34-35 — "When <u>Esau was forty years old</u>, he took Judith...the <u>Hittite</u> to be his wife, and Basemath...the <u>Hittite</u>, and they made life <u>bitter for Isaac and Rebekah</u>."

Hebrews 12:15 – "(see to it) that no one is sexually immoral or unholy like Esau, who sold his birthright for a single meal."

- III. A <u>Dominant</u> Mom. (Genesis 27:5-13)
 - 1. Desires to control your decisions.
 - 2. Manipulates you to get her way.
 - 3. Lives in a disordered love.
 - 4. You feel smothered and small.
- IV. A <u>Deceitful</u> Son. (Genesis 27:12-29)
- V. A <u>Deeply Wounded</u> Family. (Genesis 27:30-46)
- VI. A <u>Determined</u> God. (Genesis 27:28)

Acts 2:23 — "This Jesus, delivered up according to the <u>definite plan and foreknowledge of God</u>, you crucified and killed <u>by the hands of lawless men</u>."

John 13:27 — "...Judas took the bread, <u>Satan entered into him</u>... Jesus told him, <u>'What you are about to do, do quickly</u>."

John 13:31 — "When Judas was gone, Jesus said, 'Now the Son of Man is glorified and God is glorified in him."
